Cheryl is our Patron.

She is a real-life East-Ender, and was born in Bethnal Green many years ago!! Her bubbly personality was evident even in the early days of Bucks Fizz, when they won the Eurovision Song Contest in Dublin in 1981. They went on to gain world-wide recognition selling over 15 million records with a string of more than 20 hits including three number ones — The Land of Make Believe, My Camera Never Lies and of course

Making Your Mind Up, which went to No 1 in nine countries around the world.

Cheryl continues to work with Mike Nolan and Jay Aston from the original line-up of Bucks Fizz — they are now known as The Fizz. 2019 and the start of 2020 saw them appearing in numerous gigs and festivals around the country and there are many gigs in the diary for the remainder of this year and next year. They will be restarting their "Up Close and Personal" Tour in September 2021. The much-acclaimed album "The F-Z of Pop" was released in 2017, a collaboration with the genius Mike Stock, and their first ever Christmas album was released in November 2018 called "Christmas with The Fizz". A new material album was released in 2019 "Smoke and Mirrors" and they are in the studio at the moment recording another album. Check out their website www.thefizzofficial.com

Cheryl started her TV presenting career in 1984 and since then has presented or appeared in countless TV programmes, including the legendary Record Breakers, which she presented for 11 years. In 2018 Cheryl appeared in Dancing On Ice, lasting a credible 5 weeks. She was also seen early in 2019 in the Channel 5 series Celebs Go Camping.

Cheryl has appeared in many theatre productions – Happy Days The Musical; Dial M For Murder; Footloose The Musical; The Wizard of Oz; Beauty and the Beast; Honk!; Seussical The Musical; Menopause The Musical; Mixed Feelings and Anybody For Murder? Plus many pantos – oh yes she did!!

Cheryl feels it is a privilege to help charities whenever possible and is involved with many, including Demelza Hospice Care for Children and Abigail's Footsteps, whose mission is to improve bereavement training for midwives and provide vital equipment in maternity units.

Cheryl lives in Kent with her husband of over 30 years, Steve Stroud, their twin daughters Kyla and Natalie (who have performed at one of our Festivals), and their German Shepherd dog, Cuba.

The safety of children and vulnerable adults is paramount and all, without exception, have the right to protection from abuse. All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately and all the charity's trustees and volunteers have a responsibility to report concerns.

1. PURPOSE AND FUNCTION OF THE FESTIVAL

The object of the Festival is to advance the education of the general public in the Arts, particularly the Arts of Music, Speech and Dance, by providing a public platform for amateur performance, coupled with the assessment of that performance by professional Adjudicators.

2. THE FESTIVAL ENVIRONMENT

The Festival is held at Eastbourne Winter Garden, which is a council run venue with paid staff to support during the Festival, however, the whole of the Festival is run by volunteers.

It is our policy to inform and involve parents, guardians, carers and teachers in partnership with the Safeguarding lead in order to ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, a safe environment at the Festival.

3. TO WHOM DOES THIS POLICY APPLY?

This policy relates to all children under the age of 18 years, and members of vulnerable groups of any age whose needs are identified to the Festival organisers on the entry forms and prior to their arrival at the Festival. This should be done by contacting the Festival Office in writing at the address shown in the heading of this document. Our Festival actively seeks, wherever, possible, to meet these needs, but we must know beforehand in order to prepare support, or let you know should we be unable to help.

4. FESTIVAL PERSONNEL

The volunteers are recruited, and approved by the Management Committee and the Safeguarding Lead, from people who have shown an interest in the Festival, and have offered to give their time. They indicate the sort of tasks that they would prefer to undertake.

Each volunteer is required to supply a written reference. All jobs have had a risk assessment to ensure that a DBS (Disclosure and Barring Services) check is carried out where necessary. These records, with the contact details of all volunteers are filed at the Festival Office. All volunteers are provided with a short job description for the duties they carry out.

The duty rota for each day is on display at the Festival venue. Each volunteer on duty will wear a badger/lanyard. The Duty Officer in charge of the session will wear a distinctive badge/lanyard. Anyone wearing a badge/lanyard may be approached in case of a problem and will be able to direct you to the responsible person who will deal with it.

At the venue there will be an office available where problems or concerns can be heard and dealt with in private. All problems will be taken seriously and will be documented and dated and held securely in the Festival Office.

5. PREPARATION FOR ATTENDANCE AT THE FESTIVAL

We are informing parents/guardians of this policy by the following means:

- a) A copy of this policy is included in the syllabus and the programme. Teachers are expected to take responsibility for seeing that parents, guardians or carers in charge of their pupils are aware of this Policy and to confirm acceptance of this responsibility by signing the entry form.
- b) Copies of the Policy are on display at the Festival venues and on our website www.eastbourneperformingartsfestival.co.uk

When parents/guardians/carers are not personally attending with their children/charge, this Policy requires them to be satisfied that their children/charge will be accompanied by a responsible adult acting on their behalf. This includes being taken between dressing rooms and stage.

6. PERFORMANCE AREAS AND CHANGING ROOMS

Backstage areas at the Festival will be supervised by DBS accredited volunteers. Access to these areas is prohibited except in the presence of one of the volunteers, the venue's staff or approved adult supervising children under the age of 6 years.

Single sex changing areas will be provided but will not be supervised.

No one may enter the changing rooms unless authorised by the DBS accredited volunteer on duty. Teachers must submit the names of their volunteers/chaperones for their Groups prior to the Festival. No admittance to the changing room will be allowed to anyone whose name has not been submitted. Proof of identification must be shown with photographic evidence such as a passport or driving licence. Only one adult/helper admittance per child is allowed in the changing room.

Supervision of children and/or vulnerable adults in all other parts of the Festival venues is the responsibility of teachers and/or parents/carers.

7. PHOTOGRAPHS, VIDEOING AND PRESS PHOTOGRAPHY

The use of all audio or visual recording equipment and of mobile phones is **strictly prohibited**. A clearly identifiable Official Photographer is available at agreed times. It is the responsibility of parents who do not wish their child to be photographed to ensure that the child does not take part when photography is in progress. We ask that the teachers for all groups are aware if there are any participants who may not be photographed and to act accordingly.

8. REPORTING AND RECORD KEEPING

All concerns during the Festival should be reported immediately to the Festival Office/Safeguarding Lead. As necessary all details and information will be obtained/recorded and taken to a higher authority if required.

9. COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS

The Festival committee will follow the latest government regulations and guidelines that are in place leading up to the Festival.

These will be published nearer to the date and also be available at the time of the Festival.

10. POLICY REVIEW

The Organisers will constantly review their Policy, improving and enhancing it as necessary. In doing this, they will look to the British and International Federation of Festivals for support and that body, in turn, will look to other agencies for good practice, most notably the NSPCC and the Arts Council of England policy guidelines.

This policy runs alongside the British and International Federation of Festivals Child Protection and Online Safety Policies.

PRIVACY NOTICE

The Eastbourne Performing Arts Festival is a competitive festival of the performing arts, run by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission (Registered Charity No. 278903). It is a member of the British and International Federation of Festivals (BIFF).

This privacy policy explains how we use any personal information we collect about you. We promise to keep your data safe and private; not to sell your data; and not to share your data with third parties without your specific permission.

We collect information about you when you register to perform in the Festival, volunteer as a steward or we engage you as an adjudicator. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the legitimate reason for this, i.e. where an entrant may need support to participate in a class. Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the Festival.

We want to make sure that your personal information is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove information you think is inaccurate. You also have the right to ask us to remove your details from our database.

The Festival will not pass collected data to any third party unless the law requires us to do so, or, if it is to enable the Festival to fulfil its constitutional purpose. It should be noted that only names and ages of competitors and the name of Dance Schools will appear in the Festival programme.

Our website provides links to other websites. This privacy policy only applies to our website and on-line entry system, so when you link to other websites you should read their own privacy policies.

You have the right to request a copy of the information that we hold about you. This can be obtained, without charge, by application to the Festival Office.


ON LINE ENTRIES

Our entries will be through our On-Line System. Therefore, they MUST all be on time, because once the system is closed for entries, we will not be taking any more. Where possible we are asking your Dance/Drama/Music school/teacher to make the entries.


The following will show you a step-by-step guide how to make your entry. The instructions are given for a Personal Computer, but our system is Mobile Friendly.

Click the link on our Website or Facebook page. You will be taken to the home page. In the top right-hand corner, click **LOGIN**. You will see the following box.

To create a new account, please click Don't have an account?




You will then be taken to the following screen:



Complete the form to 'Register'.

You will be taken back to the Home Page. In the Top Right-Hand corner, you will see Account. Continue with My Account.

Your details will come up on the Welcome Screen, and the following will be at the top of the screen.



Performer	Schools	Entries	Quick Add
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Inputting their Full Name, Day School, Date of Birth and Gender. You will then need to also go into the Schools, to input which Music, Drama or Dance School that the named performer attends.

We are encouraging all entries to be done by the schools, and they **WILL NOT** be able to do this if you have not registered the performer with this information. If your school is not listed, then please contact them to input their information; if you are making the entry independently yourself you will have to send The Festival an email with the school information, so that it can be input into the system.

All of the Schools selected WILL HAVE ACCESS TO THE PERFORMERS PROFILE in order to make the necessary entries. Please note that you are ticking/clicking to say that you have read the Terms & Conditions and Syllabus, which is on our Website.

The Profile must be input by the parent to ensure that a Performer is only on our System ONCE. By individual schools inputting the Profiles, we can avoid doubling up Performer details.





Register here to input your schools' details. Once this form has been completed, The Festival will approve the school before any entries can be made.

Once approved entries can be made for all Performers that are registered to your school, so please ensure that this has been done. Once the Performer is input into the system, they will remain there, so registering them only needs to be completed this year, and will be able to be accessed in future years. It will be down to the person registering the Performer to remove them should they leave/change schools.



This screen is under Categories, (then Dance for example) the information can be narrowed down by inputting the class genre or performer age. Showing this following screen, once the class has been selected.



If the performer is on the system, they will appear when you start to enter their name. You can then Add to cart. This can only be done if the Class is Open. There is also a Quick Add section, where by clicking on the entrant, then the Quick Add – only classes available to that entrant will be shown. Once all the entries have been added, you can then carry onto complete the full entry and Checkout. Payment can be made on the system using a Credit/Debit card under our secure payment system.

When the entry has been accepted, an email will be sent to the school, the profile email address of the performer and a receipt will also be sent to whomever the payment was made by.

Once the classes are closed, we will only be able to accept entries under exceptional circumstances, but we will do our very best to be obliging. Should any amendment need to be made, either email the Festival or contact the appropriate Entry Secretary.

PREMIER AWARDS

PORTMAN TROPHY is presented for the highest mark awarded in any solo class in the Festival for age 12 years and under (excluding examination music).

HOLLANDS CENTENARY TROPHY presented for the highest mark in any solo class in the Festival age 13 - 19 years inclusive (excluding examination music).

NATIONAL WESTMINSTER BANK PLC BOWL for the highest mark awarded in any solo class for competitors age 20 – 59 years.

KAY HAMMON TROPHY for the highest mark obtained in any solo class by a competitor age 60 years or over.

PAUL HARRIS YOUTH BOWL for the highest mark in Piano or Strings (excluding examination music) awarded to any solo competitor in the age group 13 - 19 years inclusive.

EASTBOURNE MUSIC CLUB CHALLENGE TROPHY for the highest mark awarded in any solo vocal or instrumental class (excluding examination music) for competitors age 18 years or over.

ALFRED COGGAN MEMORIAL TROPHY awarded for the highest mark in piano solo or instrumental classes (excluding examination music).

FLORENCE NEAL PREMIER SHIELD for the highest mark awarded to any dancer in the Open Dance Classes.

DEREK ELLIS MEMORIAL AWARD presented annually to the performer who, in the opinion of the adjudicators, has shown the most outstanding ability.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

Please examine these regulations carefully as all Festival regulations must be adhered to. If any rule of the Festival in infringed disqualification may result.

- The Festival is registered under the Data Protection Act 2018 (revised 2021) and holds personal data only for the purposes of running the Festival. No information is disclosed to third parties.
- Parents/teachers/chaperones are reminded that it is their responsibility to maintain supervision of their children and their pupils whilst they are on Festival premises. When children are backstage waiting to perform, or are performing, the Festival Stewards will take that responsibility.
- It is necessary for teachers and parents to be aware of their responsibilities when entering any performers with limited physical capabilities or special needs, bearing in mind the limitations of the stage and surrounding environment. It is also necessary for the teacher or parent to make the Chairman aware of any such information that would impact on the adjudicators' work.
- 4 EPAF endeavours to maintain a safe and secure environment for its many participants. All our performing and associated areas are monitored by clearly recognisable stewards. COMPETITORS SHOULD CAREFULLY STUDY THE PARTICULAR REGULATIONS AFFECTING EACH CLASS THEY HAVE ENTERED. This Festival is intended mainly for amateurs. For purposes of this Festival, an amateur is someone who does not derive their livelihood from the branch of performance, defined by the class title, in which they seek to enter the Festival. In any ensemble, all members must adhere to that principle. 'Professionals' may only enter Open Classes or take part as Conductors or Accompanists.
- ALL ENTRIES MUST BE SENT VIA THE OFFICIAL ONLINE ENTRY SYSTEM (including full payment) by the closing date. Entries may be made by the entrant if over the age of 18, or by the entrant's parent/guardian, however, Schools are encouraged to make all entries. All Duets, Trio, Quartets, Mini Group and Group entries are to be made by the Teacher/School. An email of confirmation will be sent.
- 6 ENTRY FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE unless the Festival rejects the entry.
- 7 ANY ALTERATION TO ENTRIES (i.e., TRANSFERS OR SUBSTITUTIONS) REQUESTED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES WILL INCUR A CHARGE OF £2.00 PER ENTRY.
- As from the commencement of the Festival, no substitutions are allowed in Solo Classes. Under certain circumstances one substitution may be permitted in Duet or Mini Groups subject to prior approval of the Dance Festival Secretary, confirmation by the Festival Office and payment of a fee of £2.00.
- Any substitutions must be dealt with before 08.30 hours on the day of the competition or the entry may be disqualified.
 - Transfers and substitutions do not take preference over any entries on an existing waiting list.

- The Committee reserves the right to accept or reject an entry and no entry will be considered to have been accepted unless the entry fee has been paid. THE COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO DISCONTINUE ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES BEFORE THE CLOSING DATE FOR ANY CLASS IF IT IS CONSIDERED THAT NUMBERS HAVE REACHED THE MAXIMUM.
- 11 The Competitors age is their actual age on 31st August 2023. In all classes involving entries for Duets, Trios, Quartets, Mini Groups and Groups all members must be of the age, or between the ages specified. See additional regulations for dance.
- In Choral Classes all performers must have been bonafide members of the choir for at least two months prior to the date of the competition. Members of School Choirs or groups must be on the school register at the time of the Festival. All choirs are allowed a conductor.
- NO COMPETITOR WHO HAS GAINED A FIRST PLACE IN ANY OF THE MUSIC AND SPEECH CLASSES HELD IN THE EASTBOURNE PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL OF 2022 MAY REPEAT THEIR WINNING PERFORMANCE IN THE 2023 FESTIVAL.
- A different "Own Choice" piece must be chosen for each Music or Speech class entered. A clearly named copy of the pieces selected, as "Own Choice" should be handed to the HALL STEWARD before the commencement of the class, with the competitor's ticket. The title of "Own Choice" items and the name of the composer/author and publisher must also be clearly written on the reverse of the competitor's ticket. A copy must also be supplied for the use of the Adjudicator on the day of the competition.

 FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS RULE MAY RESULT IN THE COMPETITOR NOT BEING ALLOWED TO PERFORM.

ALL UNAUTHORISED PHOTOCOPIES WILL BE RETAINED AND DESTROYED BY THE FESTIVAL. *See notes at the end of the Rules*

- The services of a piano accompanist may be made available if required. However, you need to apply to the Festival Office on 01323 729013 or by email to info@eastbourneperformingartsfestival.co.uk An admission ticket for the piano accompanist will be provided for the class concerned on request.
- Amateur holders of recognised diplomas may not compete in the subject for which they hold diplomas except where otherwise stated.
- 17 **EACH COMPETITOR IS ELIGIBLE TO WATCH ALL CLASSES ON THE DAY/DAYS THEY ARE PERFORMING.** On all other days (when they are not performing in any classes) competitors are then spectators and MUST pay in full for the Session/Day they are attending.
- 18 PARENTS, CHAPERONES AND OTHERS ESCORTING COMPETITORS ARE NOT ENTITLED TO BE ADMITTED WITHOUT PAYMENT.
- 19 Time limits for all classes must be strictly adhered to.

- Teachers, parents or competitors, must not directly contact the adjudicator verbally or in writing. All enquires, complaints, protests or representations must be made in writing to the Festival Secretary within seven days of the conclusion of the Festival and must be accompanied by a fee of £20.00, which will be returned if the protest is sustained. The decision of the Executive Committee in all matters of dispute will be final.
- The decision of the Adjudicator shall be final: they may stop any performance or withhold any award at their discretion.

22 Marks will be awarded as follows:

90+	An exceptional performance both technically and artistically.
87-89	An excellent performance both technically and artistically.
84-86	A convincing performance both technically and artistically.
81-83	Shows some artistic appreciation and/or communication.
78-80	Shows development of technique and/or communication.
75-77	A performance limited in its communication.

23 Certificates are awarded to competitors as follows:

An Honours Certificate for 90 marks or over.

A Certificate of Distinction for over 85 marks but under 90 marks.

A Certificate of Merit for over 80 marks but under 85 marks.

A Certificate of Attainment for 75 marks but under 80 marks.

A Certificate of Participation for those classes where marks are not awarded.

Collection of Certificates and Adjudication Sheets can be obtained sixty minutes after the completion of the class, by a teacher or school representative, free of charge, at a designated area, which will be manned throughout the Festival. Should Covid guidelines not allow this, they will be forwarded to the appropriate school.

No trophies will be awarded unless the competitor obtains at least 85 marks: for Gold Medal Classes 90 marks. In classes involving two test pieces competitors must obtain a minimum average of 85 to qualify for an award.

25 TROPHIES are held for nine months but remain the property of Eastbourne Performing Arts Festival. They must be carefully preserved and returned to: Mr Beds, 21 Cornfield Terrance, Eastbourne, East Sussex, BN21 4NS on Saturdays 18th and 24th November 2023 between 10am – 12pm and 2pm to 4pm. Competitors who fail to return trophies on time may be prevented from taking an award home at subsequent Festivals.

Loss, theft, or damage must be reported to the Trophy Secretary with seven days, otherwise the Trophy Holder will be held liable for replacement of the Trophy. Winners are personally responsible for the cost of having their names inscribed on the trophy. In the event of any trophy being awarded to more than two competitors the Festival Committee reserves the right to withhold presentation.

For reasons of economy, Festival medals described as Gold, Silver or Bronze are not made of a precious metal.

- REHEARSALS ARE NOT PERMITTED ON FESTIVAL PREMISES DURING THE FESTIVAL. However, limbering and warming the voice or musical instrument are (in an appropriate area).
- 27 Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted on Festival premises.
- 28 REAL FLOWERS, POT PLANTS, LEAVES, NUTS, WHEAT PRODUCTS, FOOD, LIQUID, GLASS AND OTHER BREAKABLE OBJECTS MAY NOT BE USED AS PROPS.

 See additional regulations for Dance
- THE USE OF ALL MOBILE PHONES, PHOTOGRAPHY ETC. IS STRICTLY FORBIDDEN. EPAF reserves the right to use photographs/films taken by the appointed official photographer to promote the Festival with the permission of the competitor, parent or guardian.
- 30 EPAF and their staff cannot accept responsibility for lost property. There will be a table for Lost Property at an appointed area during the Festival only.
- No photocopy of music or verse will be accepted unless accompanied by a written authority from the publisher.

DANCE SECTION



ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR DANCING COMPETITION

This competition is for amateurs and students who do not derive the main part of their income from the teaching or performance of dance.

- The age of the competitor is taken as on **31**st **August 2023**. Accuracy of birth date essential, incorrect age may lead to disqualification, in cases of doubt, a birth certificate may be required. No dancer in a solo section may dance in a higher age category.
- Competitor's music must be uploaded to our on-line system by 20th January 2024. Details of how to do this are on page of this syllabus.
- 4 Competitors are asked to have a backup of their music in the form of USB or on an android mobile device (please have the appropriate lead for your device).
- TIME LIMITS must not be exceeded. Times will be checked from the first note or word of the accompaniment, or (if it should occur first) the first movement of the dancer to the dancer's last movement or the completion of the dancer. Please see the current syllabus/programme under the appropriate class. The dance may be stopped if the time limit is exceeded.
- Where requested (e.g., Greek, National/Global, Narrative/Character) the Title of the dance and any additional information relating to the dance, must be input to our online system in the box provided, by 20th January 2024. Please see the notes for the specific genre. The synopsis *must not exceed 20 words*. Spoken or recorded narratives after the steward's announcement will be included within the time limit of the dance.
- Competitors must dance in correct programme order (unless agreed by the Festival Office), report to the Backstage Steward 15 minutes before the start of their class and be ready to be taken to the wings before their number is announced: absentees risk disqualification. After performing the competitors (age 6 years and over) will be taken to the 'holding area' and must remain there until after class adjudication.
- The Committee may combine Sections or Classes when entries are small, divide a class when entries are large, have the power to make any other regulations or interpret or qualify any of these rules as the occasion may arise.
- 9 Photography and Filming and/or the use of mobile phones during any performance are strictly prohibited, for both Copyright and Safeguarding reasons. Fines may be incurred.
- 10 PROPS: THE USE OF REAL FLOWERS AND LEAVES, NUT WHEAT PRODUCTS, FOOD LIQUID, GLASS AND OTHER BREAKABLE OBJECTS ARE STRICTLY FORBIDDEN. Props are allowed but any prop that needs assembling side or stage is not permitted. The weight limit of each prop is 10kg. All props are to be brought at the start of the session for which they are required and removed at the end of the same session (we have no facilities for storage). Scenery, sets and staging are not allowed. It is preferable that only properties carried on by the performer pertaining to the dance, should be used. All props must be rendered fire-resistant before arrival at the theatre. The use of talc and or/oil anywhere on the body compromises safety and is, therefore, prohibited. Any props that require the stage to be swept after the completion of the dance are not allowed. The use of Rosin is only allowed side of stage but MUST BE contained in a box and NEVER scattered over any flooring or the stage this is Theatre regulations.

THE STAGE AND STAGE WINGS ARE OUT OF BOUNDS TO ALL EXCEPT AUTHORISED PERSONS AND COMPETITORS ABOUT TO PERFORM. AUTHORISED PERSONS INCLUDE ONE ASSISTANT FROM EACH SCHOOL* WHO MAY ACCOMPANY CHILDREN AGED SIX YEARS AND UNDER AND OLDER COMPETITORS FOR THE SOLO PURPOSE OF WARDROBE OR PROPERTIES. Competitors who have danced will be asked to leave the wings and return three numbers before the end of the class. *Assistants from each school must have a current up to date DBS check if over the age of 18.

12 NO PROMPTING PERMITTED

- 13 THE DANCE ADJUDICATOR CAN DEDUCT MARKS IF THE COMPETITOR FORGETS PART OF THE DANCE.
- 14 The Adjudicators consider the whole performance, including the choice and interpretation of the accompaniment, the quality of recordings and suitability of recorded vocals, and costuming (e.g., being age appropriate).
- THE ADJUDICATOR'S DECISION IS FINAL AND NO DISCUSSION OR CORRESPONDENCE CONCERNING SUCH A DECISION MAY ENSUE. The Adjudicators reserve the right not to award any place when, in their opinion, the standard of the dance is insufficiently high, or individuals who infringe these rules.
- Repeat dances are at the sole discretion of the Adjudicator and only for dancers who are 11 years or under. Dancers will NOT be permitted to re-dance unless a technical issue occurs. Handing incorrect music does **not** constitute a technical issue, and could result in disqualification.
- 17 Communication with the Adjudicators concerning any matters relating to the Competition by Competitors, Teachers, Chaperones, Parents, or other interested parties prior to or during the Competition is strictly prohibited. (See general rule number 21).
- Pre-recorded music in **any** Musical Theatre performance must **not** include any singing or chanting.

Pre-recorded music in **any** Tap sections must not include any recorded tap or similar sound effect.

- 19 Pointe work is not allowed for any competitor under the age of 13 years. Fixed tap (single sound) only may be used for Tap dancing. Acrobatic, gymnastic, hip hop and street dance are acceptable when combined with a strong dance technique. Contortion is not permitted.
- As from the commencement of the Festival NO substitutions are allowed in Solo Dance Classes. Under certain circumstances one substitution is permitted in Duet Classes and on payment of an administrative fee of £2.00. This is subject to the prior approval of the Dance Festival Secretary and confirmation by the Festival Office. (General rule number 10).
- Only one adult (parent, licenced chaperone, carer), with the exception of teachers, are allowed in the Changing Rooms. No other adults, family members, fellow students are permitted at <u>ANY TIME</u>. The Changing Rooms will be checked on a regular basis by stewards, to ensure this is the case, anyone who should not be there will be asked to leave. Separate Changing Rooms for Boys with Mothers, Boys with Fathers, Girls with Fathers and Family Facilities will be provided, upon prior request.

- Parents, chaperones etc are responsible for keeping Changing Rooms tidy. Please use provided litter bins and take home any personal belonging at the end of each day.
- PARENTS AND OTHERS ESCORTING COMPETITORS ARE NOT ENTITLED TO ADMISSION WITHOUT PAYMENT. The Auditorium will be cleared after each Session and entry wristbands will be checked upon re-entry.
- We kindly ask for all mobiles to be either switched off, silenced, or be put on an appropriate mode. We also request for you not to look at the mobiles during performances, as the glare of the screen can be off putting for the performers. If siblings wish to use electronic screens, we ask if they could sit to the rear of the auditorium.
- Admission to the auditorium is NOT permitted during any performance, any audience member MUST wait until the performance has finished.
- We kindly ask that you are not rude to ANY of the Festival Volunteers/Stewards.
- TROPHIES. No Trophy will be awarded unless the Competitor obtains a least 85 marks. In Aggregate Classes only marks of 80 or over will qualify in the total. Any mark below 80 will be excluded from the Aggregate.
 - The Aggregate is to be interpreted as the total number of marks in each of the qualifying classes.
- Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals are given for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in all Solos, Duets and Trios/Quartets. Only one medal is given in the Mini Group and Group section to the school, however, medals can be purchased from the foyer 30 minutes after the section has been adjudicated.
- Dancers may watch any other classes throughout the day they are performing. All other sessions/days they wish to watch **MUST** be paid in **FULL**. Checks will be made by our Stewards.

IMPORTANT NOTES FOR TEACHERS

Performance: The adjudicator will be looking for a complete performance. It should display exceptional technique for the age group concerned and be strong, confident, theatrical, and entertaining, with a good standard of body basics, appropriate costuming and of an excellent musical standard. Interest must be engaged at the outset and sustained until the very end.

Music: Avoid using popular music because unavoidable comparisons with professional performances will be inevitable. Music should be age appropriate and the use of inappropriate language is unacceptable. The quality of musical recording is crucial. They should be of a suitable length and without cuts that destroy the shape, development and ending of the music, spoiling the performance. All music must be uploaded to our online system before 20th January 2024. Always ensure there is a backup in the form of a USB recording or on an android mobile devise – please provide the appropriate lead.

Make-up: Theatrical make-up should be appropriate, enhancing the features to replace the colour the lights have removed. Avoid heavy make-up, blue and green eye shadows (which "close" the eyes), heavy brown blusher and pink, purple, or brown lipsticks (which become grey under the lights) and the use of face and body glitter/oil unless relevant to the theme of the dance.

Costumes: Costumes of the correct length should be well fitting with head-dresses and hairstyles that complement the dancer. Choose a well-fitted tutu that sits on the hips. Simple tutus and headdresses are preferable to over-elaboration (such as tiaras). Loss of an item of costume or loose shoe ribbons, will mark down the performance. The correct underwear is essential in all sections.

Props: If props are to be used at all, they should be flame-resistant, not exceed 10kg, be appropriate and be a fully integrated part of the performance. Hand props should be relevant to the situation showing appropriate size, shape, period, weight, and texture of the article: judged by the way they are handled, they should be convincing. Dangerous props, such as naked flame, glass, rice and real flowers must not be used. Any props that require the stage to be swept after use are discouraged.

Rehearsal

Although run throughs of dance is discouraged on the premises, we appreciate that stretching and vocal warming is essential. However, we ask if you could be mindful of other teachers/dancers and do not take up large spaces. The use of Rosin is strictly prohibited on any floor area, if used, it must be contained within a box for the dancer to use on the soles of their ballet shoes and at the side of the stage ONLY.

THE USE OF RECORDED MUSIC AT THE FESTIVAL

The Eastbourne Performing Arts Festival is affiliated to the British and International Federation of Festivals and participates in its Group Licence to cover payment of fees for the use of recorded music at its events. We do not accept liability for the infringement of copyright, recording or performing rights arising out of any competitor's accompaniment, choreography, or music at its events.

Teachers using music tracks created from commercial recordings are advised that they should themselves seek permission to re-record from the record companies concerned as the Festival cannot take responsibility for this.

According to the British and International Federation of Festivals that All England Dance are not covered by the blanket copyright agreement in respect of music/songs from shows and that as a result, teachers/performers need to obtain their own licence for such items from Phonographic Performance Ltd. BALLET (Classical) All Ages

To include Classical, Stylised or Contemporary, any style can be danced but only one per competitor.

Classical – should include Adage and Allegro.

Stylised – a communication of an idea through movement, danced with Classical Technique, may be danced with/without the use of hand props, and could reflect elements such as the Hornpipe, Spanish and Tarantella for example.

Repertoire is not allowed. Music should be drawn from the classical genre and be suited to the range of vocabulary steps utilised.

Criteria

Dancers should demonstrate the principles of classical ballet, which include secure posture and alignment, turn-out, weight distribution and placement. A well-schooled port de bras is an essential component that should exhibit correct shaping, flow, and co-ordination of the head and eye line. Attention should be paid to the grouping of fingers and relaxation of the hands.

<u>PLEASE NOTE IN THIS SECTION SOFT OR POINTE SHOES (from 13 years depending on technical proficiency) MUST BE WORN.</u>

Guidance on Costuming

should be relevant to the choice of style but also allow freedom of movement. Leg lines should not be obscured by heavy skirts as classical lines and correct technique need to be clearly visible. A romantic length tutu may be utilised if appropriate to the choreographic style.

BALLET (Contemporary) – from age 13 years

ONLY ONE CLASS PER COMPETITOR – either Classical OR Contemporary

A fusion which combines Classical Ballet and Modern Ballet styles which may or may not be danced with a parallel line of leg. Choreographers such as Crystal Pite or Wayne McGregor are examples of the type of work we would expect to see in this section, neo-classical work would also be acceptable. Soft of Pointe Shoes must be worn. Music choices could be more varied and draw from a wider body of material than is suggested for classical ballet performances.

Criteria

Evidence of a secure ballet technique should be demonstrated but displaying freedom and articulation of the spine, moving away from the traditional classical lines, is encourages. Choreography should draw from both styles of dance exploring elements and pushing boundaries where these two techniques meet. Floor work may in incorporated.

Guidance on Costuming

Costume should be suited to the style of the piece and allow for freedom of the movement and complete visibility in the body lines.

NATIONAL/GLOBAL DANCE

All dances are to be traditional music and technique appropriate to the chosen country, using traditional dress/costume and footwear. Younger competitors are expected to demonstrate traditional performances, seniors may introduce theatrical performers that are clearly based on a National Tradition. The choice for this section is broad and encompasses both traditional folk dances and dances drawn from the rich body of cultural dance practises from around the world. Performers are encouraged to do a little research on their chosen country and where necessary, the reason behind the story they are telling.

Criteria

The dancer is expected to deliver a performance which captures the essence of the chosen country; footwork and body movements should have an authentic feel with the arms coordinating in the correct style. A theme maybe used but is not compulsory, small props which help to create an authentic story can be incorporated into the performance. The floor patterns and choreography should mirror those used in the chosen area (as appropriate to specific region/style). The musical choice should incorporate the spirit of the country but does not have to be a traditional folk piece.

Guidance on Costuming

The costume should be authentic with the correct length of skirt or trousers and an awareness of the material types used in the Country. Footwear should be appropriate for the style. Jewellery can be worn if it complements the authenticity of the costume.

NARRATIVE/CHARACTER

In this section you may portray a character, fictional or non-fictional, or you may choose to interpret an animal or an element from nature, a feeling, an emotion, or something more abstract. The fundamental element of the performance should always be focused on the storytelling and development of the narrative. Demi-character could be presented in the section.

Criteria

The acting skills and an ability to communicate using the whole body should be visible throughout. The performance must have emotion and feeling. The character should be expressed through the body and facial expression with a clear sense of purpose behind the movement.

We would normally expect a classical genre to be utilised for this section, however, on the odd occasion other form of dance may be used if they aid the characterisation. The technique must be consistent throughout and appropriate to the piece as a whole. The chosen dance technique MUST serve the purpose of the storytelling, a hybrid and creative utilisation of different dance techniques will be accepted.

Some examples: A tap dance to the song 'Mr Bojangles' would not be suitable if the movement does not convey a story; The use of tap to portray the Mad Hatter in *Alice in Wonderland* (as in the Christopher Wheeldon ballet) would be suitable; A modern dance with lyrics is not a narrative dance – although it may interpret the lyrics, however, a dance performance that focused on global warming for instance, that used jazz vocabulary, could be used as a narrative piece if the overriding purpose of the choreography was to tell a story; *La Fille Mal Gardee* contains a clog dance which is a character piece; A piece exploring the issues/characters within *West Side Story* that utilises a hybrid of jazz and classical ballet work could be construed as a narrative piece; Lipsynching to a song, in a characterised manner, is not a character dance. All choreographers are asked to consider the appropriateness of the topic to the age of the dancer. Alongside, sensitivity and thought must be given to the context in which the performance is presented and to ensuring that chosen themes are also appropriate to a competition aimed at young performers.

Exception: Classical Greek would not be accepted here as the genre already utilises characterisation and interpretation as part of its own performance criteria. However, in a hybrid form, a character piece could draw from Classical Greek vocabulary if suited to the mood and feel of the characterisation.

Guidance on Costuming

Costumes and make-up should reflect the character being portrayed. Footwear, if required, should also be suitable and appropriate to the character, the style and period and should always facilitate correct technique. NB Please see further guidance on the use of props which are only necessary if enhancing the overall performance – Rule 10, Dance Section Additional Rules.

CLASSICAL GREEK

Based upon technique of Ruby Ginner, classical Greek is performed barefoot and essentially showing the use of opposition and relaxation through the movements which are core to Ms Ginner's work. Dancers should reflect the title. Myths, studies from nature and modern-day themes are acceptable, together with the accompaniment of many different genres of music or the spoken word, provided the movement are given their appropriate interpretation and relate to one or more of the seven styles of this technique – Lyric, Athletic, Bacchic, Pyrrhic, Choric, Ritual or Tragic.

The choreography should be based upon the natural movements of the body such as Standing, Walking, Running, Skipping, Leaping, Jumping and Spinning, whilst experiencing the cultural connections to other arts such as Sculpture, Ceramics, Painting, Poetry, and Music. Aspects of the performance should include expression, use of breath and musical understanding. Also demonstrated should be balance, strength and control, relaxation, elevation, and flexibility through the spine.

Criteria

The dancer should demonstrate the correct technical and artistic requirements for the relevant styles – lyrical, athletic, bacchic, pyrrhic, tragic, choric or ritual. The use of breathing, weight and relaxation and full use of the body should be evident throughout. The use of the spine, body turn and precision of line should be secure. The quality of the movement dynamics should match the chosen style, whilst showing fluidity and sensitivity where relevant. A connection and response to the chosen music, words or sound should be demonstrated.

Guidance on Costuming

Costuming and use of props should be relevant to, and enhance, the portrayal of the title, myth, or theme of the dance. Bare feet should be worn for the Classical Greek technique.

JAZZ MODERN

Jazz utilises the underpinning of a clear jazz technique in its presentation. There is plenty of scope for freedom int the style, choice of music and theme, if relevant. The term Theatrical Jazz refers to the fundamental jazz dance techniques which evolved from musical theatre into more contemporary hybrids such as modern dance and which may incorporate influences from contemporary dance. The term Theatre Jazz does not dictate that the source material must be derived from musical theatre and the two should not be confused (although it is clearly permissible to use this style in the genre). Choreography should reflect the rhythms and dynamics of the music, clear sustained technique in turns, kicks and elevated steps and should avoid being solely based on limbering movements. Tricks can be utilised, but should have purpose to the piece, ensure that the focus/consideration is given on the linking steps in between to help with the flow in the transitions.

Criteria

Clarity of line through the limbs and body. Control in technique (turns, kicks, elevation). Use of dynamics and rhythmicality. Stamina and consistency in performance.

All routines should observe safe dance practice and MUST be appropriate for the age and ability of the performer. Suggestive music and choreographic content are not acceptable for a Festival platform. Music with offensive lyrics is also not suitable.

Guidance on Costuming

There is complete freedom in the costuming, it should allow for freedom of movement and not obscure the line of the dancer's body. Any costume should be appropriate to the age of the dancer and considers modesty. *No jewellery is to be worn*.

LYRICAL MODERN (from age 11 years)

Lyrical Modern allows the dancer to interpret the music and lyrics through movement and encourages a sense of musicality and connection between the dancer and the accompaniment. The use of breath is important and strong technical application will allow for simplicity and space in the presentation. Highlights in the movement should match that of the orchestration/musical arrangement.

Lyrical Modern is pure interpretation of the music and should, therefore, show fluidity, resistance, suspension, relaxation, purpose and create physical shapes that are aesthetically pleasing. Vocal or non-vocal music may be utilised, however, if interpreting the lyrics, the performance should be consistent throughout. The choreography should have continuous sense of flow showing breadth, expansion, and release. Whilst the use of floor work is permitted, is should be kept to a minimum. As yourself, does the music suggest going to the floor?

Music should be age appropriate and the size of orchestration and emotive content should relate to the age and ability of the dancer.

Criteria

The dancer should demonstrate a sustained technique, extension, and continuity of line where relevant and fluidity in the movement. The music should be embodied fully within the performance and the two elements should work in harmony with one another. A range and richness in dynamics should be ever present in the work. Throughout, the use of space and freedom in the movement should be evident. The emotive response should come within and not be forced or contrived.

Guidance on Costuming

Costume choices can be varied and creative, they should allow for freedom of movement and compliment the lines created by the dancer. The costume should have some link to the quality of the music and the fluidity in movement of the dancer.

CONTEMPORARY Modern

Breath should inform movement, with weight, swing, suspension, and release applied. Choreography should explore themes and the use of contraction, extension, and relaxation should be explored along with the use of the spine. The performance should avoid being presentational and dancers should demonstrate they have deep understanding of what initiates movements and why. The space should be explored in a multi layered way including levels, planes, and facings.

At its core the work should demonstrate a clear underpinning of recognisable contemporary dance techniques (such as Graham, Cunningham, Horton, Release) which may be amalgamated. However, the choreography should not be a hybrid of modern theatrical dance, which is not contemporary dance in its purest form.

Criteria

The work should be rooted in Contemporary Dance techniques. Theme and/or choreographic devices should be apparent in the presentation of the work. A sequential use of the spine should be clearly understood. Clear initiation of movement is essential.

Guidance on Costuming

Costume for this style will be dictated by the style and theme of the piece. The line of body and shape of the movement should always be clearly visible throughout.

Title and Synopsis required informing the audience of the choreographic intention, no more than 20 words, to be uploaded to our online system.

All styles and developments in technique, including characterisation and humour, are encouraged providing the rhythms, clarity of beating and presentation of the routine is fully sustained and appropriate to the chosen musical style. Pre-recorded music for **any** Tap classes must not include any recorded tap or similar sound effect.

MUSICAL THEATRE

Musical Theatre encompasses the 'triple threat' abilities of performers and adjudicators will consider – Vocal ability and technique; Acting through song and connection to the words; Acting through dance and/or movement.

The choice of material should be both suitable in terms of age and cultural identity. Characterisation and believability are integral to the performance, and it is important that the song choice is relevant to the performer. The lyrics are important, and clarity of diction should be thought about. Breath control and pitching are also a key element and need suitable training. The

key of the accompaniment should be within the range of the performer and it is permissible to change this to suit the voice type. Dance should not be included for the sake of it and should flow naturally out of the lyrics and characterisation. Pedestrian movement and staging are considered appropriate, and each action should have a clear purpose and intention. Any genre of dance can be utilised, the focus should be that the genre enhances the role that is being played and is in keeping with the character and era of the chosen material. Ensure that the performer understands the context, period, and locations of the song and/or musical.

For younger candidates in Pre-Junior, it is acceptable for the performers to choose songs that are not necessarily drawn from musical theatre.

Pre-recorded music in any Musical Theatre performance must not include any singing or chanting.

THERE IS NO REQUIREMENT FOR THE PERFORMANCE TO CONTAIN 50% SONG AND 50% DANCE. Criteria

Suitability of the song choice to age of performer; Vocal placing and pitching; Characterisation and connection to the wors; Appropriate use of movement and/or dance; Understanding the context of the piece.

Guidance on Costuming

Costume choices should reflect the period and setting of the song choice and the character being portrayed. Footwear should also be suitable, and consideration should be made to what the character would wear as this will also dictate the type and style of movement incorporated. For example, bare feet would not be suitable for a song that is set on the streets of New York during the 1920's.

Classical Improvisation - dress is to be class wear in either navy or black and choice of footwear (soft shoe or bare foot) depending on how the dancer interprets the music and to what technique they use.

Stage Improvisation – dress to be class wear in any colour and choice of footwear (soft shoe, bare foot, stage shoe or tap shoe) depending on how the dancer interprets the music and to what technique they use.

- 3 No props allowed in the Entertainer Group class except hand props carried during the dance or routine.
- Teachers are allowed to set the staging and cue tabs but must leave when completed. For all other groups the side stage area must be kept clear.
